Who are FFN Caregivers?

FFN stands for Family, Friend and Neighbor. FFN's are unlicensed providers that care for children while parents are away at work or school.

On average, a child is in care 45-50 hours per week while parents are at work or school.

Whether you are being paid or you volunteer your services, this program is designed to support you in providing school readiness and literacy skills to children in your care. As a FFN caregiver you play a vital role in a child's future success in school and life. As a FFN caregiver, we will support you in partnering with parents to make this happen.

Research shows that social and emotional school readiness is critical to a successful kindergarten transition.



Program Components

The goal of the FFN grant is to keep children active in age appropriate school readiness activities by providing resources, training and mentoring.

Caregivers who participate will receive:

- ◆ 30 minute monthly home visit
- ◆ Age appropriate literacy activities
- ◆ Early childhood screenings
- ◆ Readmobile Site Visit
- ◆ Caring for Kids Place Points
- ◆ Child Development information
- ◆ Health and Safety items
- ◆ Free training opportunities
- ◆ Walmart Gift Cards
- ◆ Multiple incentives throughout and for completing the program.
